* Your TOEIC® Listening & Reading score will be based on the number of questions you answer correctly. There is no penalty for guessing. Pay close attention to the time, especially during the Reading Section of the test, and attempt to answer every question.

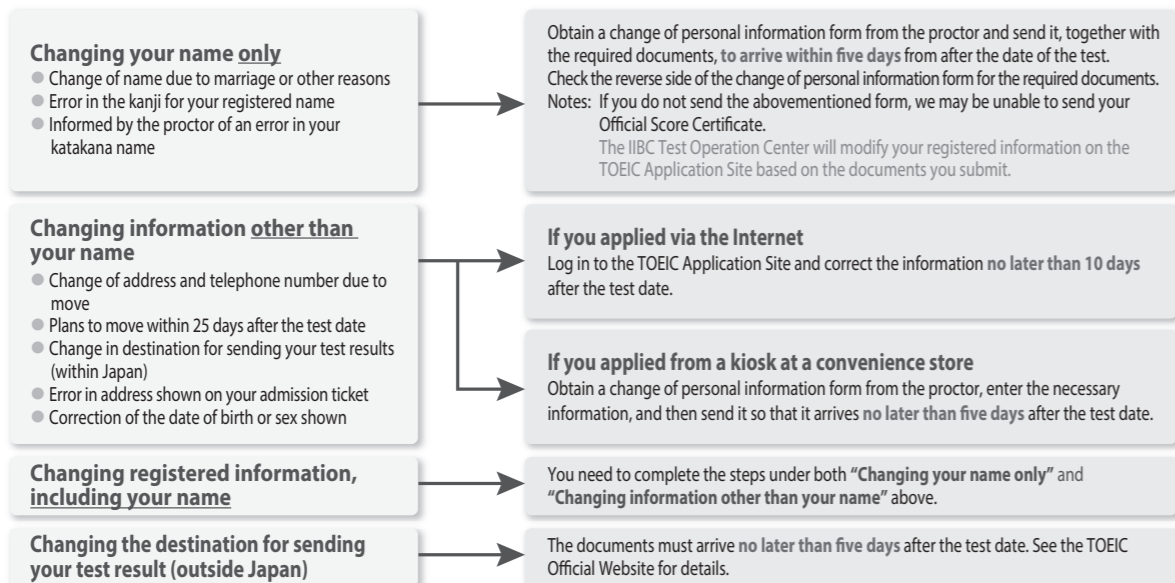

Notification of test results

Test results will be sent in the form of an Official Score Certificate to the test taker in a sealed envelope marked as confidential within 30 days after the test. (Test results may be sent to a group instead if the test is taken based on a group application.)

If you do not receive an Official Score Certificate within 35 days of the test date, please contact the IIBC Test Operation Center (03-5521-6033) within 65 days after the test date. Any notice of an undelivered certificate submitted more than 65 days after the test date will be considered a request for reissue and will require payment of a fee to reissue the certificate.

Test day schedule

*Check the locations of emergency exits in advance.

11:45~12:30	Check-in time	• Be sure to use the restroom and finish other preparations by 12:30. • Look at pages 2-3 and begin filling out Side A of the Answer Sheet.
12:35~13:00	Test explanations Listening audio check	• There will be no break after 12:30. You will not be permitted to leave the test room after 12:30. Inform the proctor if you feel unwell.
13:00~15:00	Test	• The Listening Section takes approximately 45 minutes. • The proctor will announce the starting and ending times of the test.
15:00~15:15	Collection of test books and answer sheets	• Do not exit the testing room until instructed to do so by the proctor.

What you should know before the test

- The proctor may walk around the testing room during the test.
- Raise your hand and inform the proctor if you notice anything out of the ordinary during the test.
- Take your belongings and any garbage with you when leaving the testing room.

Engaging in any of the prohibited acts indicated below may result in the following measures:

- Caution or warning from the proctor
- Your answers not being scored
- Dismissal from the testing room
- Disqualification from the test
- Checking of your belongings

- Please use an HB pencil (or HB mechanical pencil) to mark your answers. The machine cannot read answers marked using a ball-point pen or felt pen.
- If you change an answer, erase the marked answer completely and wipe away any eraser debris.

The data obtained from the responses to sections 7 through 11 are statistically processed, stripped of all personal identifiers, and used for several purposes: e.g., the identification of the TOEIC Listening & Reading Test (hereinafter referred to as TOEIC L&R) utilization, improvement of the TOEIC Program, and creation of materials for English learning.
